Fellowship Awards

Senior Fellow awards may range up to \$110,000. Other sources of income may be taken into account when determining the fellowship amount. Housing costs must be taken from the fellowship award. Travel to and from Washington, DC, will be included for the fellow, spouse, and any additional dependents.

Junior Fellow awards will total \$65,000. Housing costs must be taken from the fellowship award. Travel to and from Washington, DC will be included for the fellow, spouse, and any additional dependents.

Eligibility

For Senior Fellows:

- Academic candidates holding a Ph.D. from an accredited institution
- Academic candidates with profession credentials equivalent to that of an Associate Professor
- Academic candidates with publications beyond their doctoral dissertation
- English proficiency to facilitate the collaborative nature of the Transatlantic Academy

For Junior Fellows:

- Academic candidates who have received a Ph.D. within the past five years
- Academic candidates holding a Ph.D. in the final stages of dissertation writing
- English proficiency to facilitate the collaborative nature of the Transatlantic Academy

Selection Process and Criteria

Fellowships will be awarded on a competitive basis. Applications will be subject to an interdisciplinary Peer Review Committee, comprised of leading scholars, which will then make recommendations to the Executive Director.

Basic selection criteria:

- Compatibility of proposed research with current theme
- Quality of proposal
- Confidence in candidate's ability to be a successful member of the Transatlantic Academy, as demonstrated by their ability to work in collaborative environment and previous scholastic achievements.

Further Information

Facilities and Services

Fellows will be located at the Washington Office of the German Marshall Fund of the United States (GMF), located near Dupont Circle. Each fellow will be assigned an office, and will have access to conference rooms, kitchen facilities, and electronic resources. Windows-based personal computers will be provided, and part-time research assistants will be available based on need. Fellows will also be given the designation of Visiting Scholar at Johns Hopkins University, and will be granted full access to university libraries. Fellows are responsible for finding their own housing in Washington, DC, but some assistance may be provided by Transatlantic Academy staff.

Length and Conditions of Fellowship

Fellows are expected to be full-time in residence for an entire academic year. Preference will be given to those applicants able to be in residence for the entire proposed 10-month period. Fellows may not accept teaching assignments, additional residential fellowships, or any other assignment that would cause prolonged absences from the academy. Fellows will be expected to attend biweekly luncheons to discuss their progress and that of their colleagues, and to contribute to the collaborative scholastic environment of the academy.
